The program is open to entering high school juniors, seniors, and seniors who just graduated High School and who reside in Arkansas—all for a minimal fee!

At College Bound Arkansas Students Will:

- Participate in workshops covering topics such as self-advocacy, transitioning, meal planning, assistive technologies, and college survival skills
- Interact with team leaders who are college students who also have disabilities
- Spend three days on a college campus
- Interact with college bound peers

Parents & Professionals are also Invited!

All parents of attending students and professionals of students attending from their district are invited to attend College Bound Arkansas. Parents and professionals of non-attending student may attend one year of College Bound Arkansas without their child/student, but additional participation will require the student's attendance.

At College Bound Arkansas Parents/Professionals Will:

- Learn about the differences between Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA 2004)
- Learn about student's rights and responsibilities and what is available to help their child succeed
- Gain resources to help parents and students succeed
- Discuss new role of parent of a college student
- Interact with college service providers and college students with disabilities
