WHAT IS INDEPENDENT LIVING?

ESSENTIALLY, IT IS LIVING JUST LIKE
EVERYONE ELSE—HAVING
OPPORTUNITIES TO MAKE DECISIONS
THAT AFFECT ONE'S LIFE, ABLE TO
PURSUE ACTIVITIES OF ONE'S OWN
CHOOSING—LIMITED ONLY IN THE
SAME WAYS THAT ONE'S
NONDISABLED NEIGHBORS ARE
LIMITED.

INDEPENDENT LIVING SHOULD NOT BE DEFINED IN TERMS OF LIVING ON ONE'S OWN, BEING EMPLOYED IN A JOB FITTING ONE'S CAPABILITIES AND INTERESTS, OR HAVING AN ACTIVE SOCIAL LIFE. THESE ARE ASPECTS OF LIVING INDEPENDENTLY. INDEPENDENT LIVING HAS TO DO WITH SELF DETERMINATION. IT IS HAVING THE RIGHT AND OPPORTUNITY TO PURSUE A COURSE OF ACTION. AND, IT IS HAVING THE FREEDOM TO FAIL—AND LEARN FROM ONE'S FAILURES JUST AS NON—DISABLED PEOPLE DO.
